Tri-Refresher Held in October

Ellen Mackey, Senior Ecologist with the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California and co-author (with Bart O'Brien and Betsey Landis) of Care & Maintenance of Southern California Native Plant Gardens, was the instructor for Ditch Your Lawn! Beautiful Landscapes for a Water-Wise Future, the workshop presented by California Native Plant Society (CNPS) and Southern California Garden Club at the Sepulveda Garden Center on October 29 & 30. The workshop was approved by National Garden Clubs (NGC) as a Tri-Refresher, providing refresher credit for NGC Environmental, Gardening and Landscape Design Consultants.

The workshop addressed gardening with natives, site analysis, designing a plan, removing a lawn, installing new landscape and maintaining the garden. Replacing traditional landscapes and lawn with California native plants can reduce average homeowners' water consumption by 60% - even more when using locally native plants. To meet the eight-hour education requirement for refreshing consultants, the additional topic of backyard horticulture in the wildlife/urban interface was covered. Part of water conservation is learning what fruits and vegetables grow successfully in any given area and making sure that we plant crops that we are really going to eat and in quantities that we can eat. A lot of water is wasted when we have too much of a harvest all at one time and do not consume all of the produce.



Workshop evaluations were shared with CNPS. They included constructive suggestions for future courses. CNPS is interested in working with CGCI's clubs or districts to offer similar educational events which could be less than eight hours (as a general education event) or at least eight hours (if the host wants to seek NGC approval to use the event as a refresher for NGC Consultants).

Five Gardening Consultants and five Landscape Design Consultants (from as far away as the Fresno area) refreshed their credentials. Congratulations to

Gardening Consultants **Pat Clayes** and **Pat Zarnowski** who became Master Gardening Consultants upon completion of this workshop which was the fourth refresher for each of them. Thanks to Southern California Garden Club and to event chairman **Robin Pokorski** for offering this educational opportunity to club members, consultants and the public.

Series 25, Gardening Study School

Colfax Garden Club in Golden Foothills District is sponsoring Series 25 of Gardening Study School (GSS) beginning in January. And they sponsored California's last GSS, Series 24, in 2013! This should tell you that sponsoring an NGC school can be a worthwhile endeavor and if you do it once, you may do it again.

Register as soon as possible to attend Course I at the Shady Glen Recreation Hall in Colfax on January 16 & 17. Contact Chairman Myrtle Findley for more information (530-346-2450 - Myrtle@exwire.com). Mark your calendar to attend Courses II (March 5 & 6), III (May 14 & 15) and IV (September 17 & 18).

Attend Gardening Study School to learn about all aspects of gardening. Course I addresses basic botany, soils, plant propagation and growing outdoor flowers. The special supplemental subject is grafting. This is the first California GSS to use NGC's new GSS curricula. Those who complete all four courses (and pass exams and belong to a garden club) will become NGC Gardening Consultants. All Gardening Consultants in good standing are eligible to refresh their certificates at one of these 2016 courses which are currently the only scheduled GSS refreshers for 2016.

Harriet Behrens

We are sad to report that Harriet Behrens of Orange County District, one of CGCI's two NGC Five-Star Members (achieved Master status in all four NGC schools), passed away on October 11. Harriet was a long-time supporter of many CGCI schools, served as a past Landscape Design Council Chairman and has been recognized as a Consultant of the Year.

California Consultants Council Awards

Award of Merit in Landscape Architecture Awarded

CCC member, BJ Boland recommended landscape architects, Cindy Benoit and Chris Drayer, for their design to update and refurbish the landscape of two of the most viewed gardens in Balboa Park for the 2015 Balboa Park Centennial. It was approved by three Master Landscape Design Consultants and will be presented January 11, 2016. Colorful succulents, bromeliads and low-water shrubs create a contemporary landscape while maintaining the classical appearance of the park. Partnering with San Diego Horticultural Society, a colorful, low-maintenance and water-wise landscape was installed to show off the highly visible gardens around the Timken Museum and Casa del Prado. In addition to the landscape plan pictured, the Balboa Park Plant Legend and color plant list were included with the submission.



Landscape Design Certificate of Appreciation, Recognition and/or Achievement Awarded

An application for the above CCC award was received honoring San Diego Horticultural Society (SDHS) and approved by three Landscape Design Consultants. SDHS is recognized for their various project(s) for the Friends of Balboa Park "Adopt a Plot" program. It was the first project implemented and became the model for updating plantings of other garden plot areas within Balboa Park. Working with landscape architects, Cindy Benoit and Chris Drayer, who created the landscape design planting plan, SDHS purchased the plants and SDHS volunteers installed them. SDHS went on to also replant the formal rose garden at the historic Marston House, the main Promenade in the middle of Balboa Park, the Children's Garden and the Natural History Museum. San Diego Horticultural Society continues to support the project with ongoing weeding, mulching and financial support.
