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

From Myrtle's Garden

About ten years ago, I poked a hole over a foot deep near each rose in my rose bed. I have about fourteen roses in this bed. I poked maybe three holes around each plant. Into each hole, I poured about 1/4 cup of mycorrhizae. I have never found any aphid in that rose bed since. I am an organic gardener and have not added any chemicals to harm those little mycorrhizae, only organic feeders which I invite anyone to come anytime and search that bed for aphids. I tell my story over and over ... no one has challenged me to walk my rose garden and search. I invite someone else to try this and see if it works in your rose bed. I do, however, get aphids on roses in other parts of my garden where I do not add those little buggies.

A **mycorrhiza** (Gk.,: *fungus roots*^[1], pl **mycorrhizae**, **mycorrhizas**) is a [symbiotic](#) (generally [mutualistic](#), but occasionally weakly [pathogenic](#)) association between a [fungus](#) and the roots of a vascular [plant](#).^[2] In a mycorrhizal association, the fungus colonizes the host plants' roots, either intracellularly as in [arbuscular mycorrhizal fungi](#) ([AMF](#)), or extracellularly as in [ectomycorrhizal fungi](#). They are an important component of [soil life](#) and [soil chemistry](#).

Penny Pines

Penny Pines, a program that CGCI coordinates between the USDA Forest Service and CGCI's many clubs and districts, has become a very popular program! Over the years, many CGCI clubs and districts have greatly embraced the Penny Pines Program. As forest fires continue to destroy our National Forests, the USDA Forest Service needs your help to replant the National Forests in California so that visitors may continue to enjoy our National Forests' natural beauty and the abundant wildlife that make homes in our National Forests. In addition, replanting also helps to control erosion.

Here's how it works: Clubs, districts (and individuals) send \$68 (or multiples thereof) to purchase a plantation(s) (which consists of approximately 350 trees), usually in their area, either "in honor" or "in memory" of a special person in their club/district or a relative




of a member. A certificate of appreciation and thank you note are sent to each donor.

Step 1: Obtain a Penny Pines Forest Choice Form from the CGCI website. [Click here](#). Write check(s) payable to "Forest Service, USDA" in the amount of \$68 (or multiples thereof). Send Penny Pines Forest Choice Form and check(s) directly to the Forest Service Supervisor in one of the participating National Forests. [Click here](#) to see a list of the participating National Forests and addresses.

Step 2: Obtain a Penny Pines Notification Form from the CGCI website, [click here](#), to report donation(s) to Pat York, the Penny Pines Chairman. The notification will enable your club's/district's donation(s) to be listed in *Golden Gardens*, CGCI's official magazine.

process of reviewing your application form by supplying all of the information which is required. This is a first come/first serve program, so you want to make sure that your application is complete before you send it to [Lynne Hansen](#), CGCI *Golden Gardens* and Website Editor.



Remember that there are only two requirements after your club or district has received a grant:


1) Grant funds must be used before June 30, 2011; and 2) Club/district must write and submit an article WITH PHOTOS to CGCI for publication in *Golden Gardens*, on the CGCI website and in the CGCI eNewsletter.

Parliamentary Tidbits

The motion to amend is perhaps the single most used subsidiary motion. Use this motion whenever you want to change the wording of the motion under consideration. Use it to make a good idea better or a bad idea more palatable. Amendments are really at the heart of the process of perfecting motions before a final vote, and the importance of understanding the basics of amending cannot be overstated (from *Robert's Rules for Dummies*.)

NGC Parliamentarian Joan Corbisiero, PRP, presented a workshop, "Let's Make Amends," at the recent NGC Fall Board Meeting in Great Falls, Montana. Here is a brief summary: The purpose of a subsidiary motion to amend is to change the wording of a pending motion. When applied to a

main motion, the motion to amend takes precedence over the main motion and is debatable and amendable. Three forms of the motion are to insert or add words, to strike out words, and to strike out and insert words (in combination).

In handling the motion to amend, the presiding officer (the Chair) after debate is concluded presents the question (consideration of the amendment), calls for those in favor to say "aye" and those opposed to say "no," and announces the result (the amendment to strike or insert "X" is adopted). The Chair then presents the question on the main motion as amended, and takes the vote.

In recording amended motions in minutes, include the wording of the motion as adopted or otherwise disposed of (with the facts as to whether the motion may have been debated or amended before disposition being mentioned only parenthetically).
